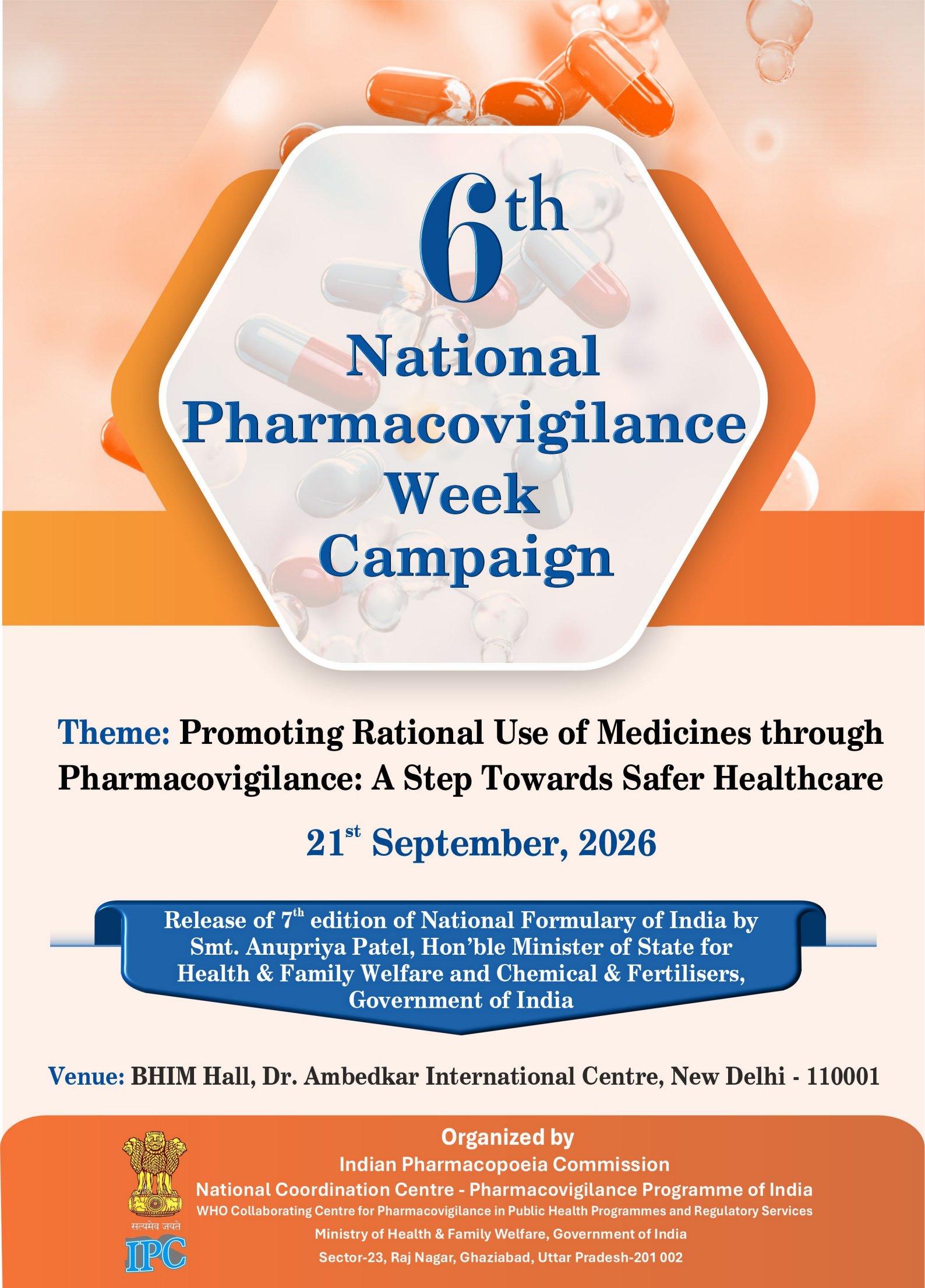

Steps for Registration



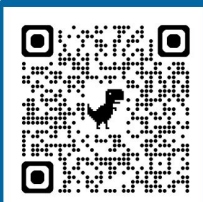
1. Scan QR Code & fill the registration form

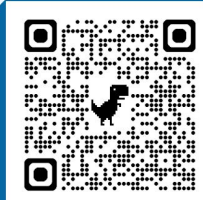

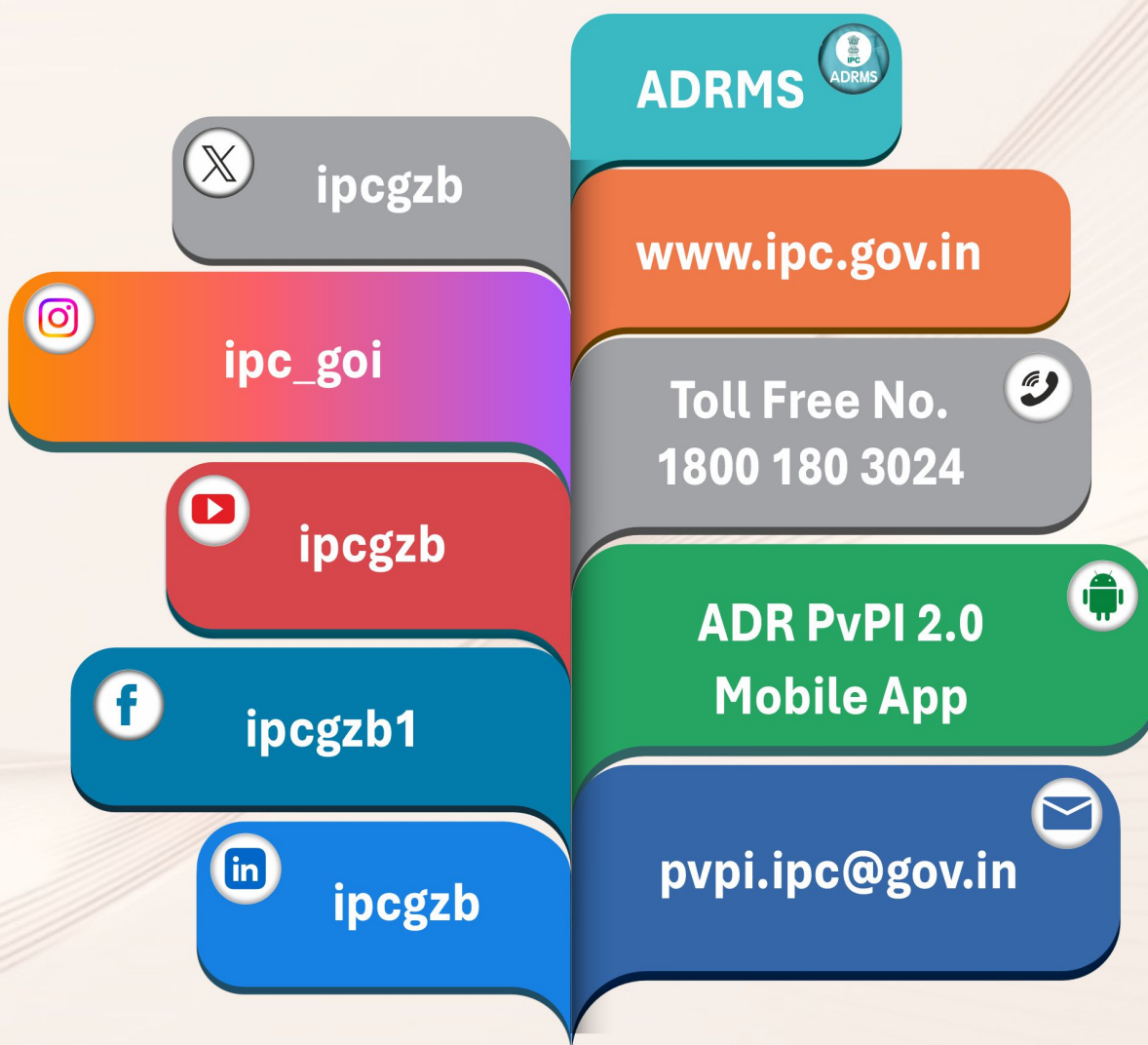
